We are willing to consider new name if the majority believes so. Wanda- I believe it's a great idea, because our campus is starting to become more diverse. Does the title sound inclusive enough? We would like for the organization and students to consider taking a more social justice approach, and to conduct more research on this. If the club is put in place, more student participation will be necessary. Good luck with it, and it's a great idea. Jackie- PEACE had similar ideas to SOAR. Dash- Could SOAR possibly coordinate with Global Citizens? I am seeing a lot of similar goals between the clubs. Kyle- SOAR still needs a mentor, and will consider joining together with Global Citizens Society once we form. Isaura- I'm an alumni, and I was involved in almost all of the organizations that were previously mentioned. I'm making a suggestion to form with Global Citizens Society, and it would be a good idea because they already are doing it because it's open to all forms of discrimination. It would be beneficial to look into that, and also the constitution for Global Citizens Society and PEACE for an idea of what you feel meets the desires of SOAR.
